Capturing an Escaped Mouse in the Hood

Gently scoop the mouse up or get ahold of the tail/support them with your arm

- ✓ Cup the mouse in your hands if it is gentle



- ✓ Use the Enrichment Tube to let the mouse run in and hide



Capturing an Escaped Mouse in the Room

Try the methods for capturing an animal in the hood if you are able if NOT

- ✓ Place a clean cage on its side in a quiet corner and let the animal run into it
- ✓ Request DLAR Staff Assistance



Capturing an Escaped Mouse in Hallways
